



Year 7 Catch Up Funding

The Year 7 Catch-Up Premium will be used by the School to deliver additional tuition or intensive support in small groups, giving pupils valuable support to diminish the difference towards ARE.

The government allocated a maximum of £500 in respect of each student who was at a maintained school in Year 6 who had not attained the national floor standard in reading and/or mathematics. That standard has been set at a score of 100.

The Year 7 Catch-Up funding is to be used by the School to provide literacy and numeracy catch-up support for Year 7 pupils. It will enable those pupils that did not achieve the floor standard score of 100 in reading and/or mathematics at Key Stage 2 to be given the opportunity to catch up by the end of the academic year.

The funding can be used in the following ways;

- Individual tuition
- Intensive small group tuition
- External services and materials

For the academic year 2017/18 the School received £7,388. The funding was spent in the following ways:
